

Reflections of the Lord Mayor Roundel Competition 2018 – Results

Judging has taken place at Asia House for the annual ROTLM Competition for the design and creation of a stained glass roundel for presentation to the 688th Lord Mayor, Lord Mountevans, at a gala dinner at Trinity House, London, on 1 May 2018.

Professional stained-glass artists were invited to design a roundel that featured elements of the achievements, supported charities and personal interests of Lord Mountevans in his time of office as Lord Mayor during 2015-16, and also that included reference to ROTLM's support for the Lord Mayor's Charity Appeal. There were a number of very high-quality entrants from practising stained glass artists.

Judges included members of the Glaziers' Livery Company alongside Chris Seow, founder of ROTLM, and representatives from the Sea-Cadets and The Lord Mayor's Charity Appeal.

The Competition also had sections for Sea Cadets and primary school children (Years 5 & 6). The winning designs in those sections will be made up by a professional glass artist and there were also prizes of vouchers towards art supplies.
